

If you are like me, there are times that you read or hear something from the Bible that just confuses you. Those two little words "I AM" fell into that category for me. Why would God tell Moses to tell the Israelites that "I AM has sent me to you."? Oh, I've heard different messages on the subject, i.e., "Fill in the blank after I AM for who God is.", or "Replace AM with the word 'Exist.'" Or my favorite, "If God is I AM, that must mean that I am NOT." Good messages with some thought-provoking ideas to be sure, but nothing I had heard on the matter really satisfied the lingering question in my heart: Why did God choose "I AM" for His name at that moment in time?

It was several years ago during a time I was working as a tenth through twelfth grade English teacher in a Christian school that this question kept surfacing in my mind and heart. The Abeka curriculum we used all the way through high school included grammar, vocabulary, and spelling. As part of the process in learning vocabulary words, we also learned the meanings of prefixes, roots, and suffixes of words. For example, the prefix "pre-" means "before"; the suffix "-ist" means "person or object that does a specified action"; and the root "CARDIO" means "heart". Putting the pieces together can help to determine the meaning of a word, like a cardiologist is a doctor who specializes in hearts.

During one of those vocabulary lessons on prefixes, roots and suffixes, I felt God speaking directly to my heart in answer to that nagging question I had been having about His name of "I AM". As I looked over our lists for the week, my eyes fell on one little root word....AM. You may have noticed from my previous paragraph, that root words are depicted in all capital letters, whereas prefixes and suffixes are not. Apparently, I had never paid much attention to that little root word of "AM" before because I couldn't readily recall the meaning of it. But as I recognized that this little root word looked exactly the same as God's name for Himself—"AM"... capital A, capital M... my curiosity grew to find out the meaning. And right there, in the tenth grade spelling/vocabulary book, was the answer I had been searching for that spoke to my heart and soul. AM means love! That's right... the Latin root word am means "love"! In that moment I felt the Lord telling me, "I LOVE, that is who I AM, and that's the message I want you to know."

What more important message could we receive from our God than those two little words....I LOVE! It's the message God has given us time and time again in His Word, and it's the message He gave us in sending Jesus who proclaimed it and demonstrated it over and over during His time here on earth. It's the ultimate message Jesus left for us in dying on the cross for our sins. He loves us that much, and He is willing to answer those questions we have about Him in our hearts if we are willing to ask and then listen.
