it's a heart issue:

- We can't have two masters, or two loves (Matthew 6:24)
- Where is your treasure? (Matthew 6:21)

slaves to money:

- The borrower is a slave to the lender (Proverbs 22:7)
- Owe no one anything, except to love each other (Romans 13:8)

trust God, He provides:

- We are choked by worries, riches, and pleasures as we go (Luke 8:14)
- Ask God and don't worry (Philippians 4:6-7)
- God will supply your need (Philippians 4:19)

tithe:

- Jacob commits to give a tenth of all that God gives him (Genesis 28:22)
- One tenth is holy to the Lord (Leviticus 27:30) give generously:
- Show mercy and give (Psalm 37:21)
- Be a cheerful giver (2 Corinthians 9:7)

work hard:

- Look at the example of the ant (Proverbs 6:6-8)
- Provide for your house (1 Timothy 5:8)
- Work for the Lord in whatever you do (Colossians 3:23)

plan well:

- Diligence leads to abundance, impulse to poverty (Proverbs 21:5)
- Know where your money is....make a budget (Proverbs 27:23+24)
- The foolish devour all they have (Proverbs 21:20)

- out of the picture?
 When adults look at you and your friends, what do you think they see? What
- would they think is important to you or your "treasure"? Are their thoughts true?

 How have you seen people be slaves to money and the people they owe money?
- In what ways are you planning on providing for yourself through out college? Read Mark 12:41-44 Why did Jesus say that the widow gave more than the wealthy? How can you do the same now and in the future? Who is someone you look up to because of their generosity? Describe them.
