BELONG

What kind of thing are you likely to forget about and need frequent reminders?





Going Deeper: To learn more about sanctification, explore the following passages and discuss what each says on the topic: Leviticus 20:8, John 17:15-17, Romans 15:15-16, 1 Corinthians 6:11, 1 Thessalonians 5:23.

GROW

Most people in church at Thessalonica were Gentiles who had trusted in Jesus after growing up in other religious beliefs and likely held very different standards regarding many things, including sexuality. **Read 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8.** What guiding principles do you see in Paul's commands and warnings?

What is God's design for sexuality? How does God's design conflict with what is acceptable in our culture? What does this mean for Christians who desire to follow Jesus today? Why is it worth pursuing God's design? How does Paul's commands and warnings from **1** Thessalonians **4** help us today?

Based on the way Paul addressed things in this section, how were the Thessalonian Christians living? (Consider the end of verse 1.) Why do you think that Paul felt like these topics needed special attention if the people were generally doing well already?

What does "sanctification" (used in verse 3) mean for followers of Jesus? How does this passage help clarify its meaning for us? Pause for prayer and allow time for private confession to God regarding any sexual sins and ask God for forgiveness. Be specific. Ask Him to grant the strength to overcome any temptation in this area.

What practical measures can you take (or are you taking) to live a sexually holy life? Where can a person who seeks to follow God's design find help?
