Faithfulness in Prayer

I am the youngest and only girl in my family, and my mom and I had a really special relationship. Growing up, she was an amazing cook and hostess. She taught me about serving in our church and helping the poor in our community.

In 2012, my mom was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. Our relationship changed as she progressed through the stages of the disease, and I moved from the role of daughter to caregiver.

My mom's personality changed as the disease progressed. She was generally soft spoken and shy, but not so in the later stages of the disease. She lost some of her inhibitions and had no care about social norms. She would greet everyone she met with a hug and kiss. I think



mostly because she didn't want the person to think she didn't remember them, so she just greeted everyone like they were a dear friend. I am sure this caught many strangers off guard and made others feel uncomfortable. But I know it blessed many who were marginalized. Those who no one would hug or looked dirty and maybe didn't have family, she would hug them and kiss them and tell them God loved them. She truly loved like Jesus did. She showed warmth and acceptance and love to everyone she met. "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of

God! And that is what we are!" 1 John 3:1a NIV

After she greeted you with a hug, she would tell you that she would pray for you. Growing up, I am sure she prayed for me; but she never talked about the specifics. In the last several years of the disease, she was very bold to tell everyone she met about her prayers. She would repeat over and over that she prayed for me and my husband and our kids every night. There were little slips of paper in her bedroom and her purse with names of those she wanted to remember to pray for. I was often cynical and thought she was incapable of coherent prayers at that stage of the disease. But the truth of Romans 8:26 is "... the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans." I believe God communed with her even when she lost the ability to speak at the end of the disease. She lived out Romans 12:12 - "Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer."

> My mom passed away last August after a 7-year battle with Alzheimer's. I can get sad over the things she is missing out on in my kids' lives, but I have to remind myself that as a believer in Christ, she has the promise of a renewed body and mind in eternity. By her example, I am now challenged to love others extravagantly and to pray faithfully.

for our Fellowship Congregation: New Web System Conversion PLEASE READ!

For over a year, we have been working with a third party company to help us securely migrate to a new church management system. And on Friday, March 13, your web account will be on a new platform! What does that mean for you?

- 1. On March 9-12, our Fellowship website and database will be off-line due to a system conversion (i.e. all online registrations and online payments will be suspended). If you are needing to register for an event, make a payment, or place a one-time online gift, you will need to do so BEFORE those dates using Bank Account draft only or AFTER those dates using any form of payment. Credit Card usage will resume March 13.
- 2. Please LOGIN TODAY to your Fellowship account at fellowshipnwa.org and double-check that all your contact information is accurate in "Family Members" (name, phone, address, email). When conversion is complete, you will receive an automated email that will allow you to reset your password, giving you continued access to your current groups, registrations, and giving history.
- 3. On the weekends of March 13 (Fayetteville Campus) and March 20 (Rogers Campus), we will be rolling out a NEW CHILDREN'S CHECK-IN system. Plan to arrive a little earlier to services on those dates so that you will have plenty of time to learn the new touch-screen monitor system.
