# **CLARITY** discussion guide *Sunday, February 2, 2020* **Epiphany:** Jesus is Transfigured Luke 9:28-36

### BELONG

What do you do when you don't know what to say? Have you ever blurted something out that you immediately regretted? Share with the group; misery loves company!

#### GROW

#### Read Luke 9:28-36.

The disciples have a literal mountaintop experience. What do you think they were thinking and feeling during the events described in this passage? Have you ever had a spiritual "mountaintop experience"? How did that experience (those experiences) make you feel?

Why did Jesus select these three disciples for this experience? What is the significance of Moses and Elijah being there? What does this experience reveal about Jesus and His place in salvation history?

Why is Peter's remark ill-placed? Why does Luke say "He did not know what he was saying" (9:33)?

What does the cloud that envelopes them represent? How does God's statement in 9:35 tie this event to the baptism of Jesus (Luke 3:21-22)? Why is the significance of the event described in this passage?

**Read John 1:14 and 2 Peter 1:16-18.** How did the experience of seeing Jesus in His glorified state affect John and Peter? How would this experience have motivated them in their walk with Christ when things were difficult? What keeps you spiritually motivated in your daily life?

What has encouraged you lately? Who could you encourage this week in their spiritual life? Have you seen evidence of Jesus working in someone's life recently? Find a way to encourage them this week.

How does this passage help you see Jesus more clearly?
