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WHY SHOULD WE STUDY THEOLOGY?

1. Because true worship requires knowing the true God.

ROMANS 10:2-3

For I can testify about them that they are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge. ³ Since they did not know the righteousness of God and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness.

2. Because true discipleship requires us to pass on all that Jesus taught.

MATTHEW 28:19-20

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

3. Because true mission requires proclamation of the true message of Jesus.

GALATIANS 1:6-9

I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you to live in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel— ⁷ which is really no gospel at all. Evidently some people are throwing you into confusion and are trying to pervert the gospel of Christ. ⁸ But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let them be under God's curse! ⁹ As we have already said, so now I say again: If anybody is preaching to you a gospel other than what you accepted, let them be under God's curse!

WHAT ARE SOME PITFALLS IN DOING THEOLOGY?

1. Pride

1 CORINTHIANS 8:1b

But knowledge puffs up while love builds up.

2. Loss of mystery or denial of truth

DEUTERONOMY 29:29

The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may follow all the words of this law.

3. Commitment to a man-made system

MARK 7:8

“You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions.”

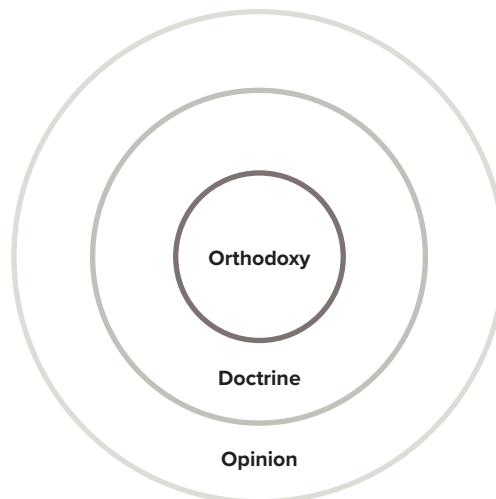
