# **Offenses and Forgiveness**

"Jesus said to his disciples: "Things that cause people to stumble are bound to come, but woe to anyone through whom they come."

### Luke 17:1

"Offenses". Even the word makes you bite your lip when you say it. It isn't even an attractive word rolling off the tongue. It means to hurt, harm and snub.

Two Biblical characters come to mind when the topic of being offended is discussed: David and Joseph. These men were among the most beloved men whose lives were preserved in the Bible. Yet, their lives were certainly not devoid of trials, tribulations, and that daunting word: offenses. Both of these men were offended by people they were devoted to.



David's injustices came through his mentor, King Saul and his own son, Absalom, who both, out of envy, tried to kill him. David refused to retaliate because he loved these men. But, he loved the Lord more and chose to leave vengeance to Him. <u>1 Samuel 18:1-18</u>, <u>2 Samuel 15-19</u>

What about Joseph? He certainly had the "right" to be angry with his brothers. He had been placed in the position to get even with them for betrayal. But instead, he chose freedom. Freedom for himself and his family. *Genesis* 37:12-36

Let's think about our own lives. Those for whom we care deeply, can hurt us deeply. The more we expect from those we care about, the harder the fall when they let us down. We could lick our wounds and let bitterness grow deep, entangling our hearts like a wild, unwanted weed. This is exactly what the enemy wants us to do, and take the bait on the deadly, destructive path to captivity. But there is One who can get us out of that captivity.

The best way to avoid captivity is let God be our defender. We don't need to defend ourselves. He's better at it anyway. His timing is perfect and methods more impactful. He will avenge His people. *Romans* 12:19

No matter how big or small, it is better to let go of the offense because Jesus has forgiven ALL of "our" sins. *1 John 1:9* 

Now, I guess we have to turn the tables here. WARNING! This may sting!

Offenses go both ways, even with the best of humanity.

- David offended one of his officers by sleeping with his wife. He chose idleness and carnality over obedience. <u>2 Samuel 11</u>
- Joseph offended his brothers with prideful boasting of his favored position in his father's eyes. *Genesis* 37:5-11

<u>Ephesians 1:7-8</u> remind us that "In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and understanding..."

Offenses are toxic, no matter who is at fault. Therefore, may we choose forgiveness and grace.

#### Reflect and Respond:

- Have you ever been offended or hurt by a friend, family member, the church or business associate? How did you respond? Have you forgiven them?
- Have you ever offended anyone? Did you make an effort to reconcile?
- Take time now to thank our Father for forgiving us and for sending His son to take on our transgressions.
