HEBREWS | Jesus is Greater: The New Covenant

A Study of Hebrews is a devotional book produced by Fellowship to aid in understanding the book of Hebrews. The questions in the weekly discussion guide can be found in this book, along with daily readings, devotionals, and other inspirational material.

When you were a kid, what did you say to indicate truthfulness? Cross your heart? Pinky swear? Why do kids add these phrases to indicate the truthfulness of what they are saying?

Read Hebrews 8:1-13.

Look up a definition of the word "covenant." How would you define it in your own words? Circle every instance of the word "covenant" in the passage. Notice the two covenants mentioned and the differences between them.

Re-read verses 1-2. What is the main point each writer is making? What does it mean?

What word or phrase from this passage has the Holy Spirit brought to your heart or mind? Re-read the passage and ask Him to speak to you through a word or phrase if He hasn't brought one to light. Why might that phrase be significant?

As we focus on the new covenant, we see the old covenant disappear. As you meditate on this new covenant, what things in your life are keeping you from focusing on Jesus? What inferior things in your life are drawing your gaze backward rather than forward to Christ?

Read Luke 22:14-20, focusing on verse 20. How does this connect the sacrifice of Jesus with the new covenant?

What does this passage tell us that Jesus is greater than? How will knowing that Jesus is greater affect how you live this week? Consider closing your time together by taking communion.
