

* Christians who faithfully donate 10% OR MORE to their church and Christian/charitable organizations (whether they consider themselves "tithers" or not). Barna estimates 5% of Americans tithe. This equals 10 MILLION people donating more than \$50 BILLION dollars annually. 12% of born-again Christians tithe.

Jesus knew the potential risks of dealing with our <u>material wealth</u>

Matt. 6:24

No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.

Over <u>2350</u> verses in the Bible have to do with finances and our possessions

Jesus talked more about material wealth than prayer, heaven, faith, hope, etc.!!

God looks for <u>faithfulness</u> in managing His possessions Matt. 25:21; Luke 16:1-2

Matt. 25:21

His master replied, "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!"

Luke 16:1-2

Jesus told his disciples: "There was a rich man whose manager was accused of wasting his possessions. So he called him in and asked him, 'What is this I hear about you? Give an account of your management, because you cannot be manager any longer."

<u>Work</u>

 <u>92%</u> of people who go to work are unhappy, don't like their jobs, can't wait to quit or retire

<u>God's view of work</u> – It is <u>good</u> - was part of a perfect <u>creation</u>

Gen. 2:15 The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden <u>to work it and take care of it</u>.

Work is <u>commanded</u> both in OT & NT

Exod. 20:9-10 Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God.

2 Thess. 3:10

For even when we were with you, we gave you this rule: "The one who is unwilling to work shall not eat."

Earning money Work develops <u>character</u>

Col. 3:22

Slaves, obey your earthly masters in everything; and do it, not only when their eye is on you and to curry their favor, but with sincerity of heart and reverence for the Lord.

Earning money Work is God's means of <u>support</u>

Eph. 4:28

Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with their own hands...

Work can/should bring <u>satisfaction/fulfillment</u>

Eph. 6:7-8

Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not people, because you know that the Lord will reward each one for whatever good they do, whether they are slave or free.

Work is God's way to provide for your <u>family</u> and for <u>others</u> in need

Eph. 4:28

Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must <u>work</u> with their own hands, that they may have something to <u>share</u> with those in need.

What you <u>earn</u> from working is what God has given you to spend

Contentment is not based on what we earn or have. It is a learned behavior.

Phil. 4:12-13

I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength.

I Tim. 6:6 But godliness with contentment is great gain.

<u>Discontentment</u> is the primary marketing strategy in our culture. (I Sam. 16:7; Rom. 12:2)

I Sam. 16:7

But the LORD said to Samuel... The LORD does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.

Rom. 12:2

Isaiah 55:8-9

The most significant difference, in God's view of material wealth and our view, is that the <u>Living Lord</u> is the central focus.
