This week we begin our Lent series. If your group hasn't already discussed how you will engage Lent together, this would be a good time to do so. You can review pages 51-55 of the Clarity book for more information on the nature and purpose of Lent.

BELONG

Who is the most famous person you have ever encountered in person? What was it like? What is it like for your community when a really high profile person visits?

GROW

Read Luke 19:28-34.

Why was it important for the biblical writers to share the story of how Jesus got the colt? What does this tell us about the events that are unfolding in this chapter?

Read Luke 19:35-40.

What are the people believing about Jesus in this passage? What do they expect Him to do when He reaches Jerusalem?

Read Zechariah 9:9 and Psalm 118:26.

How has the Old Testament prepared Israel for this moment? What does Jesus' response to the Pharisees in [verse 40](#) tell you about the significance of what is happening?

Why did Jesus wait until the last week of His life to be so open about being the Messiah? Why, at that time, was His claim to kingship so important?

If you were to use one word to describe Jesus, what would that be?

Is Jesus king of your life? How will you respond to the King of kings today? How are you walking in humility and committing to Jesus in this season of Lent?

How does this passage help you to see Jesus more clearly?
