Let's remind ourselves of some of His ways...

Act justly, love mercy, walking humbly with God <u>Mic. 6:8</u>).

Give to the one who begs, and do not refuse the one who would borrow from you <u>Matt.</u> <u>5:42</u>).

Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another just as God in Christ forgave you (<u>Eph. 4:32</u>).

Give justice to the weak and the fatherless; maintain the right of the afflicted and the destitute. Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked (<u>Ps.</u> <u>82:3-4</u>).

His ways call us to action, not to passivity. They beckon us to give our time, our emotions,

our money instead of hoarding them. They invite us to cultivate eyes that see, ears that listen, and hearts that feel deeply for the things that He is about, for people and purposes far beyond ourselves. Jesus tells us that in losing our lives—surrendering our agendas, our comforts, our expectations to Him and for His sake—we will actually find life (Matt. 10:39). Yet another counter-intuitive call to action from our counter-cultural King.

So as we enter into the holiday season, let's pray with the psalmist that He might turn our eyes from looking at worthless things, and give us life according to His ways, that we would be so filled with Him that we might pour Him forth to our loved ones and those in our community.
