Live as SENT

If you only had two steps to prescribe someone struggling with temptation, what would you encourage them to practically do that embodies trust in Jesus and following His example?

What is a story or two of your own victory through temptation? How might sharing those kinds of stories glorify Jesus and intrigue someone to consider Jesus for himself or herself?
