MISSION & VISION | The Gospel

Mark 1:1-15; Romans 1:1-4; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4

Can you remember a time you received some surprising news? Was it good news or bad news? How was the news delivered? Why do you think you still remember it so clearly?

Begin your time together by reading these passages aloud:

Mark 1:1-15; Romans 1:1-4; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4.

What is the Gospel message? How would you explain the “good news” of the Gospel to someone who had never heard of it? How does Mark 1 help us answer that question? What sort of response does the Gospel message demand?

What are some rival messages that people believe instead of the Gospel? What do those rival messages promise? When do you feel your heart being drawn to a rival worldview instead of the Gospel? What do you do to re-center on Christ when you sense you are being captivated by something that is not the Gospel?

How can we be agents of change for the Gospel? What would it look like to bring a robust and full understanding of the Gospel into your family life? Your workplace? Your neighborhood?

Close your time together by **reading Matthew 5:13-16 aloud**. Thank God for the good news of the Gospel and ask Him to help you bring this redeeming message into your sphere of influence.
