What does [John 1:14](#) tell us about the nature of Jesus? How can you know Jesus more? What specifically can you do this week to know Him more? How does reading the Bible help us to know Jesus better?

What do you believe about Jesus? What are some statements you can make about Jesus based on [John 1:1-5](#) and [1:10-18](#)?

How has this study helped you to see Jesus more clearly?
