BELONG

Do you think “live every day as if it’s your last” is a good philosophy? Why or why not? Why is it hard to let something that seems far away influence your decisions and actions today? Share about a time you acted without regard for the future and then regretted it.

GROW

Read [Mark 13:32-37](#) aloud.

What are some commands (or imperatives) in this text that tell us to do something? Why does Jesus tell us to do those things?

Do you think that Jesus has specific work that He wants you to do? What do you think it is (or how can you process this if you aren’t sure)? How are you seeking to see this accomplished every day? How could your group work together to discover and accomplish the things the Lord wants you to do?

Scripture promises Jesus is returning. How do you feel about that? Are you excited? Fearful? Doubtful? Share your feelings with the group.

How does the promise of Christ’s return impact the way you live your life now?

How does this passage give you a sense of urgency when it comes to spiritual things? Is there a conversation with a friend or loved one about the Gospel that you have been putting off? What steps can you take this week to begin that conversation?

What do you think gives meaning to someone’s life?

This is the final week of our theology section in the Clarity series. How has this study helped you to see Jesus more clearly? What are you taking away from this eight-week series that has focused on a theological understanding of Jesus?
