Rescue and Wandering

Big Idea: God has the power to rescue. How is God more powerful than a raging sea?



Table Talk:

Read Exodus 14:5-7 May want to read in storybook bible pg. 92-99

Why did Pharaoh decide to pursue the Israelites, even after all God had done?

When are times when you have forgotten how powerful God is and made a decision based on your own desires?

Did Pharaoh believe God was worthy to be in charge? Did he ultimately get what he wanted?

Read Exodus 14:13-21

Who parted the Red Sea? Who is the most powerful over all? Do you believe that with your heart?

Activity Walk:

- Take some playdough and build the scene of the Red Sea crossing together. Add as much detail as desired. Examples: sea walls, chariots, Pharaoh, the Israelites
- Spend time researching the Red Sea. Print out maps and pictures for a realistic view of what it looked like. Research animals and things that might live in the Red Sea. Have the older (or adapt for younger kids) do a little research project on it. A little research page example is at the top.
- Have a campfire together as a family. God went before the Israelites and placed Fire by night and a Cloud by day to separate and protect the Israelites from Pharaoh's army until he parted the Red Sea.
