HEBREWS | Jesus is Greater: Faithful Living

Hebrews 12:1-2

A Study of Hebrews is a devotional book produced by Fellowship to aid in understanding the book of Hebrews. The questions in the weekly discussion guide can be found in this book, along with daily readings, devotionals, and other inspirational material.

We use the saying "don't take your eye off the ball" to describe a situation where it is important to pay attention to the matter at hand. Have you ever been in a situation where you "took your eye off the ball"? What happened? Why is it easy for us to lose our focus on the main thing?

Read Hebrews 12:1-2.

Box the word "therefore" in verse 1. Look back and remember the previous chapter to gain context for what the author is about to say. Review last week's discussion. How does reading these two verses in light of Chapter 11 change how we understand them?

Underline the two "let us" phrases. What is the author is encouraging us to do?

Circle any descriptions of Jesus and what He has done. Which of these get you excited? Which one is unclear to you or confuses you?

What does it mean to fix our eyes on Jesus? How does doing this actually affect your life today?

The author exhorts us, "Let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely" (Hebrews 12:1 ESV). What sins or weights are inhibiting you from running after Jesus with all you've got? To whom will you confess this? Who will you ask to keep you accountable and to run with you?

What is the joy set before you? How can you experience joy today in this future hope?

What does this passage tell us that Jesus is greater than? How will knowing that Jesus is greater affect how you live this week? Close your time together in prayer, thanking God for Jesus, that He endured the cross for you to make a way for your redemption. Ask God to fix your eyes on Jesus as your motivation to run after Him with endurance.

As a group, listen to (or better yet, sing!) the song, "Be Thou My Vision." Think about the words and let them be a prayer.
