Have you ever experienced a moment of panic? What was happening that caused you to suddenly feel fear? How did the situation turn out? Would you do anything differently if you could do it over?

How are you seeking God and His will in your life? What adjustments have you made and what changes do you need to make to follow His will? Pray that He would lead you today and that He would strengthen you to follow His will.

GROW

Read [Luke 22:39-46](#).

What is Jesus asking God to do in these verses? What is the cup that Jesus refers to? (See [Isaiah 51:17](#) and [Jeremiah 25:15](#)). Why do you think Jesus is in such anguish ([v. 44](#))?

How can you be more intentional and vigilant in your prayer life? What practical steps can you take this week to see that happen?

How does this passage help you to see Jesus more clearly?

Jesus prays “Not my will, but yours be done” ([v. 42](#)). What do **you** mean when you say to God, “Your will be done”?

How have you viewed prayer in your life? Do you think that it matters? How do you picture God when you pray to Him?

Read [Luke 22:47-54](#).

Why do you think one disciple draws his sword ([v. 50](#))? What does Jesus’ refusal to fight tell you about Him and about what kind of Kingdom He is bringing?

What does Jesus mean when He says “darkness reigns” in [verse 53](#)? Where does darkness reign today? What is the answer to that spiritual darkness?
