Have different people read each of the following passages out loud: **Hebrews 1:3**, **John 1:1**; **Colossians 2:9**; and **Mark 1:9-11**.

Why is it critical to believe that Jesus is fully divine and not just another human? How does understanding the Trinity help you understand Jesus better?

What are some statements you can make about God based on those passages?

How has this study helped you to see Jesus more clearly?

While it's true that the word "Trinity" never appears in the Bible, it's a theological concept derived from Bible study. What do you see each member of the Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) doing in Mark 1:9-11?
