

Draw on a few spots to make it look cow-like, then with it positioned over a cup poke a tiny hole in the "udders" with a small needle.

Make Butter in a Mason Jar



Making homemade butter is a delicious way to get kids in the kitchen.

Ingredients


- cow's milk cream
- salt


Instructions

- 1. First, get yourself some cow's milk cream. Fresh, raw cream is best, but you can certainly try this with heavy cream from the store.
- 2. Place the cream in a mason jar, ideally no more than 1/3 of the way full. In this photo, we had already started to whip the cream, so it appears to be more full, but you really want to make sure you have plenty of air space for the "butter concussion" or the splashing action that turns cream into butter.
- Put the lid on tight and then SHAKE!
- 4. You will notice the cream start to become heavier, and thicken, and ultimately the buttermilk will separate from the butter. This can take anywhere from a few minutes to a half hour or so and will go faster if your cream had warmed slightly from refrigerator temperature.
- 5. You will start to see granules of butter, separated from the buttermilk.
- 6. Strain the butter into a colander or small strainer, and save the buttermilk for pancake or biscuit making!
- 7. Now, at this point, most recipes call for "washing" your butter under cool running water. But since we don't have running water, we simply placed the butter into a bowl of clean water, and used two wooden spatulas to press the butter into a solid mass. You can also do this by hand with a kneading motion.
- 8. Once you have worked the water out of the butter, you can salt it to your liking. Now grab a slice of fresh bread and enjoy this amazing treat!










Pigs:



Pigs in the Mud

Print out of pig


Washable brown paint

Gallon baggie


Shaving cream




Chicken coop play




Sheep counting

Sheep Shearing Activity

Sheep shearing is the **process** by which the woolen fleece of a **sheep** is cut off. The person who removes the **sheep's** wool is called a shearer. Typically each adult **sheep** is shorn once each year.




Wool, or wool fleece, is traditionally harvested from sheep to be used in **things** like clothing and bedding. Wool has a texture and crimp that makes it easier for the fibers to bind together, making wool a bulkier and more insulating material than other fibers.






Make a paper plate sheep. Spray some shaving cream foam on the sheep. Now encourage your child to scrape off the wool.







HEN FLAP: Tuck your hands under your arm to make wings like a hen. Flap your wings as you strutt across the room.






DUCK WADDLE: Place your heels togetherwith your toes apart. Place your hands at your sides as you waddle across the room.


